Hypertherm Earns 2011 Spirit of New Hampshire Award

HANOVER, NH—Nov. 9, 2011—Hypertherm, a United States based manufacturer of advanced metal cutting products, today announced it is a recipient of a 2011 *Spirit of New Hampshire Award* in the Volunteer Program Champion category. *The Spirit of New Hampshire* awards are presented by Volunteer New Hampshire and the Office of Governor John Lynch to honor volunteers as well as supporters of volunteer programs.

Hypertherm was recognized for providing each associate was 16 hours of paid community service time (CST) each year, and for actively encouraging its associates to volunteer. “We’ve seen a tremendous increase in the number of associates utilizing their CST over the past couple of years which is why we felt the time was right to increase the number of hours given to each associate,” said Barbara Couch, vice-president of Corporate Social Responsibility at Hypertherm. “It benefits not only the community, but our associates by allowing them to feel a greater sense of purpose and fulfillment. This practice aligns with our long standing belief that it is important to give back to the communities in which our associates live and work.”
